A RESOURCE FOR DISCIPLESHIP

Read Acts 20:1-12 several times. Luke the historian summarizes the very start of a travel plan which will ultimately take Paul to Jerusalem. Estimates of this section is of over a year to complete; at least 8 different modes of travel; rigorous activity like hiking, meeting key leaders, giving multiple talks, helping resolve struggles in the churches, etc. It would be good to review this section of his journey by googling *Paul's 3rd Missionary Journey*. What comes up is a series of images, click on them to see the entire missionary activity. Paul has spent three years in Ephesus, which will be his longest stay anywhere. Acts 20 begins with the uproar of his challenge to the economy of Ephesus necessitating his departure. So in review of Acts 20: 1-5;

Blueprint- The development and well-being of any disciple or church requires oversight. Paul the seasoned evangelist/apostle is taking time to revisit key locations. It simply says he was giving much "exhortation" what does that involve? In your life what do you need to be encouraged in your walk of faith?

Blueprint- In the ongoing work of the church it requires cooperation and teamwork. Look at Acts 20:1, 4-5 we see Paul's team. Who are these men? Why have they come together on this trip, as we have not seen a team this large before? From where have they come and who do they represent? Billy Graham Ministries when seeking to make an impact in a region invites every pastor in the area to come together to advance the Church. Popes travel around the world at specific times to empower the Catholic Church in that country. How should Brookville Church link up with other leadership to strengthen the church in our region?

Luke makes no mention of what happened in these locations except at Troas- Acts 20:6-12. Could it be that this short story described the typical "exhortation" in that location?

Blueprint- the description of Troas starts with regular worship which is the primary task of every believer. When did they meet and what did they always do as Luke describes in this text? How often should Christians worship? Identify the three activities they did as a community in this text and are they what constitutes worship? Why is the "breaking of bread" so crucial (see Acts 2: 42-47)? How long should a "sermon" take? Does the day we meet to worship matter?

Blueprint- remaining spiritually vital and awake requires intentionality. Why does Luke spend so much time on the fact of someone falling asleep? Could he be calling attention to a condition in the church, or is it to highlight the miraculous power of God through Paul? Have you ever fallen asleep in church, or tuned out a speaker? What distracts your attention or causes a "sleepy condition"?

In conclusion, what at first appeared as a mundane text, say like reading Leviticus, has lots of hidden treasures. How can we avoid passing over details, details, details so that we pay attention to truths within such texts? I recall my spiritual director Donna Steffan opening a weekend retreat by sharing how at a recent event they assigned the genealogy of Jesus (Matthew 1:1-17 check it out) as the text given upon which to meditate. Donna shared one participant reflected it was one of their most significant experiences ever. God's Word is inspired to generate faith. Name how this study stimulated your faith.

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We welcome you today to enter into the fellowship we have with one another through Jesus Christ.
