

Paul, in this section of the Corinthian Letter (Ch. 11-14), was concerned about the issue of Christian worship. Apparently, someone confided with him about certain abuses- lack of respect for gender causing harm to the basic need for personal well-being (11: 1-16), lack of respect for the less fortunate causing divisions in the community (11:17-34), and now the over attentiveness to ecstatic utterances causing lack of respect for Spirit diversity (12: 1-11), etc.

In Chapter 12 Gordon Fee stated the primary problem was with the abuses of spiritual gifting. How does the fledgling First Century Church respond to the reality of living in God's Spirit? How can we in the 21st Century learn the lessons and corrections Paul applies to the Corinthians?

Blueprint: disciples cooperate with God's Spirit in their daily living.

Paul did not want to compare Christian spirituality to pagan tendencies. Instead, Paul attempted to describe how "living in the Spirit" was experienced (from chapter 12-15.)

Before we enter that discussion lets look at some other Pauline texts dealing with "life in the Spirit.

Read Galatians 5 How does Paul describe a Christians walk of life in the Spirit?

Read Romans 8 What can a Christian expect as we conduct our lives by the Spirit?

Read Ephesians 4 Explain how we live a worthy life according to our calling in Jesus.

Read 1st Corinthians 12 Paul seems to be suggesting we respect each other's gifting and placement in the community of faith. How would respecting one gift at the exclusion of others affect life in the Spirit?

How have you experienced the teaching on Spiritual gifts?

What do you see as your primary "gifting" of the Spirit?

Who is responsible for each person's gifting?

Why does God's Spirit extend a gift to every believer?

Who is to benefit from the use of gifts?

When and where has the Christian Church over emphasized certain gifts, or expected certain gifts to validate one's faith?

Men in America, by Tucker Carlson

In response to the mass shootings in Parkland Florida Mr Carlson ran Wednesday evening specials entitled "Men in America." Here are some of the investigated statistics;

- 1. Men die around 5 years earlier than women
- 2. Men are twice as likely to develop addictions than women
- 3. 77% of suicides are male
- 4. 90% of all inmates in prisons are male
- 5. More females than males graduate from high school to post graduate schools
- 6. 1 in 5 boys in school develop high activity disorders
- 7. 7 million work age males are unemployed
- 8. 1 in 5 children live in homes without a father
- 9. Females score higher on IQ tests
- 10. Majority of company CEO's now female
- 11. 70% of males are obese
- 12. Huge decline in male testosterone (note all the TV commercials)
- 13. Loss of testosterone contributing to growing depression and lethargy in males
- 14. Sperm counts have declined by 60% since 1997

Mr. Carlson's conclusion is that the overwhelming narrative has been male domination and female victimization leading to adverse conditions for young males. He stated, "all are suffering and a society cannot survive the growing trends."

Top 18 issues facing women today, by Sonia Pressman Fuentes

- 1. 70 million women and children on brink of poverty
- 2. Women primary wage earner in 6 out of 10 homes
- 3. 1 out of 5 college women in college sexually assaulted
- 4. 1 of 3 female homicide victims killed by intimate partner
- 5. Domestic violence issues continue to plague women
- 6. Female elder abuse on the rise
- 7. US has highest maternal mortality rate during child birth
- 8. US only industrialized nation to not have a mandated maternity leave
- 9. Human and sex slave continues to rise in America

Along with this data is the research on body image impact affecting the self image of young girls, while it seems to be slightly improving. Plus, the exploding exploitation of women in pornographic industry causes objectification of females in society.
