

The text before us this week is 1st Corinthians 12: 12-27 as Paul addressed the need for diversity amid unity. Many metaphors have been used in the New Testament to help describe the nature of the Church of Jesus Christ. To understand Paul's usage of the Human Body in 1st Corinthians 12 let us compare some other images for our understanding;

Family of God; John 1: 11-13; 3: 5-7; Hebrews 2:10-18

What does this image suggest about the nature of the Church?

Bride of Christ; Mark 2:18-20; Romans 7:1-4; Ephesians 5: 21-33

How does this affect your understanding of being in relationship with Jesus?

Flock of Shepherd; Psalm 23; John 10:1-16; 1st Peter 5:2-4

Describe what this image suggests about the relationships within the flock.

Temple with Priests; 1st Peter 2:4-10

Why does Peter, who knew the Temple and Priesthood so well, describe our role this way?

Human body; Roman 12; 1st Cor 12; 12-27; Ephesians 4: 4-13

How does this metaphor work within a culture enamored by the human physique like the Greco Roman Empire? Is America equally attuned to human body language?

Blueprint: <u>disciples understand the nature of the Body of Christ as a diverse unit respecting one another for their role, purpose and giftedness.</u>

Reread 1st Cor 12: 12-27

Vs 12-13 How does a person become a new member of the Body of Jesus?

Vs 14 How many members are there in Christ's Body?

Vs 15-16 How does this comparison affect unity and/or uniformity? In the human body how many distinct systems are there?

Vs 17 If everyone was uniform how does that affect the Body's functioning?

Vs 18-19 How did I become what I am in the body?

Vs 20-25 Name ways we are to interact as fellow members to one another.

Vs 26-27 Where and when have you experienced this reality described by Paul?

Paul in this section of 1st Corinthians has been challenging the church to respect one another. As a member of the Church how does this teaching build mutual respect?
