A RESOURCE FOR DISCIPLESHIP

We conclude our reflection on the impact of giftings on worship with this study. **Please read the entire 1st Corinthians 14.** The primary concern of Paul seems to be the effect of worship on two parties- believers and unbelievers.

Blueprint- disciples of Jesus find worship to be a place of growing, becoming more like Jesus.

1st Cor. 14: 1-12 Look for the number of times the word “edify” appears in the text. Take the time to discover the meaning of this word, in English and if possible in the original Greek language.

In your experience of corporate worship how much do you sense being edified?

What role does your gifting (spiritual perspective) influence how you sense “edification”? Example- a teacher may look for the explanation of truth, while a mercy shower wants everyone to be comforted.

Why does Paul conclude his discussion on love in chapter 13 by opening the discussion on worship with “pursue love”?

What two gifts seem to be competing with one another? What’s the deal with hearing intelligible language?

1st Cor 14: 13-19 Now Paul seeks to help the congregation see the impact of unintelligible language on the gathered believing community? What can you conclude is that impact?

1st Cor 14: 20-25 Next Paul attempts to reveal the impact of unintelligible language on the unbelievers. What can you conclude is that impact?

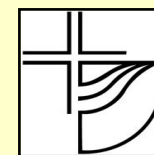
1st Cor 14: 26-33 Paul realized that unintelligible language cannot edify the believers, nor convert the unbelievers.

Again, we see his primary concern about edification in verse 26. So, what can you say are the instructions for the congregation in order to hold effective worship services?

How does Paul view the issue of these two gifts which seem to be in competition? Vs 39-40

In conclusion, we all have our firsthand experiences with corporate worship. From what you discovered from in 1st Cor 14 let’s say you find yourself on the worship team of your church. At the next meeting what would you suggest as ways to apply Paul’s concern for edification to Sunday morning worship?

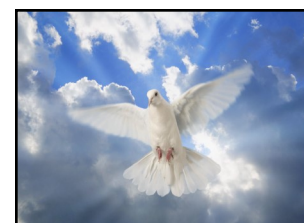
