A RESOURCE FOR DISCIPLESHIP

First Corinthians 15 represents an apparent change in subject. However, it serves as a continuation of the topic of what it means to be a "spiritual person." To summarize: a spiritual person owns allegiance to Jesus and respects the authority of their leaders by not entering into divisions (chapter 1-4); a spiritual person understands the necessity of moral purity within the congregation (Chapter 5); a spiritual person doesn't violate fellow believers by using the court system (Chapter 6); a spiritual person maintains the integrity of marriage (chapter 7); a spiritual person seeks avoidance of idolatry (Chapter 8-10); a spiritual person respects the gender issues established by Creation (Chapter 11); a spiritual person respects the Body of Christ in the communion and love feast (Chapter 11); a spiritual person recognizes the role of giftedness and membership in the Body of Christ through a loving lifestyle (Chapter 12-13); and a spiritual person respects the very nature of worship in edifying the church (Chapter 14).

But now Paul addressed a growing problem of some who didn't understand the importance of the bodily resurrection (**Read Chapter 15**). The key question of this chapter is found in vs 12, "How can some of you say that there is no resurrection of the dead?" We will break our study into three parts- vs 1-11, vs 12-34, and vs 35-58.

Blueprint- disciples affirm the Biblical truth of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Read 1st Cor 15: 1-2 Paul suggested the "gospel" he preached had been made known to him.

When, where do you sense Paul came to know this "gospel"?

Who told Paul about the good news of Jesus Christ?

Why was Paul now preaching this "gospel"?

How did the Corinthians respond to the "gospel" of Jesus Christ?

Read 1st Cor 15: 3-8 Paul recounts a memorized presentation of the "gospel." This was the first recorded text showing how the First Christians preached the gospel.

It says the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus was *according to the scriptures*. Using the texts in cross reference in your Bible familiarize yourself with the "scriptures" for vs. 3-4.

Next, in succession Paul systematically recounts the resurrection appearances of Jesus Christ. Check each cross-referenced text for vs 5-8.


Take a few moments how does this "proof" affect your personal faith in the facts of Jesus life, mission, and resurrection?

Read 1st Cor 15: 9-11 Paul described the impact of the truth of the "gospel" upon his personal life.

What was Paul suggesting to the Corinthian readers of this letter of the ways the gospel impacted him as a spiritual person? Could they see, hear, or sense this impact?

Does Jesus' resurrection have any influence on your daily life?
