A RESOURCE FOR DISCIPLESHIP

Respecting the resurrection ends his main arguments with the Corinthian Church. **Read our text this week 1st Cor 15: 51-end.** Do you get the sense of final, lasting victory for God's Kingdom residents? This week's section becomes the fourth part of Paul's plea to reject the Greco Roman culture's version of the afterlife. Those who denied the bodily resurrection of Jesus had succumbed to the false belief they were already experiencing their own "resurrection" through ecstatic spiritual gifts and personal lifestyle issues. These heretics could not understand the full measure of our own bodily resurrection from the dead!

Blueprint - disciples of Jesus look forward with the full measure of Christian hope to the time when they will be raised from the dead.

Read 1st Thessalonians 4: 13-18. This earlier text written by Paul clearly defined a future rising from the dead.

In what ways does Paul say similar truths to the 1st Cor 15: 51-58 text?

In what ways are they not similar?

Read 1st Cor 15: 51-52

If the Corinthians had begun to believe they were already in the new lifestyle of Jesus, then why does Paul emphasize the necessity of being changed?

What must change and why?

Read 1st Cor. 15: 53

What part of our being is perishable and mortal?

What part of our being is imperishable and immortal?

Read 1st Cor 15: 54-56

How is death seen as our enemy for which we need to conquer it?

Is there a "sting" in death?

Read 1st Cor 15: 57

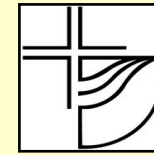
Explain how death was defeated by Jesus death on a Cross "for our sins."

Read 1st Cor 15: 58

Paul was always concerned about transformed living. In this famous funeral text used today how are Christians now to live differently because of the resurrection of Jesus as well as their own?

In conclusion, you have spent a few weeks looking into the reality of Jesus resurrection and yours in the future. Name some ways this will impact your daily life.
